


Figure 1 Thomas Frognall Dibdin, *The Bibliomania, or Book Madness* London, Longman, Hurst, Rees, and Orme, 1809 Z992.D54 1809

Dibdin's sense of humor is apparent in his use of the figure of the fool on the title page and throughout the book, which extols the risks of over-indulging the love of books. Dibdin was a major figure in bibliography, and helped to establish the principles of modern bibliography through his work on editions of the classics.




Figure 2 Thomas Hartwell Horne, An Introduction to the Study of Bibliography, London, T. Cadell and W. Davis, 1814 Z1001.H78i 1814
